Before the reading: **Glory to you, O Lord!**

¹Once more Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying: ²“The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. ³He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. ⁴Again he sent other slaves, saying, tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet.” ⁵But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, ⁶while the rest seized his slaves, mistreated them, and killed them. ⁷The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed

those murderers, and burned their city. ⁸Then he said to his slaves, the wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. ⁹Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.”
¹⁰Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests.

Paulina is continuing her education after graduating from High School; her tuition cost is \$2,200; Udamhindi and Eveline are both in their first year of High School, their tuition cost is \$1,100 each for a total of \$4,400. That is MLC's goal for 2020, \$4,400. Our sponsorship provides for all of the girls' tuition, fees, textbooks, room and board.
